



#### **ESCA Munitions Response Area by Group**








## **Seaside Update**

- Next step for the ESCA begin Residential Quality Assurance (RQA) Implementation Study




### **Overview: Parker Flats MRA**







CVC) site marker dedication ceremony took place on the former Fort Ord. Veterans, their supporters. and local elected representatives joined together to dedicate the site marker. The event also was a call to the community to join efforts honoring those who have served and defended our nation by moving the CCVC forward.

The former Fort Ord Military Reservation was active for nearly a century, and boasts a significant local and national military record. Recognizing this rich history, a group of veterans began a mission to establish a federal Veterans Cemetery on the Central Coast almost 25 years ago.

1994 Fort Ord closure made thousands of acre available and created an opportunity to locate a final resting place for veterans and their spouses. In 1997, the Fort Ord Base Reuse Plan formally Base Reuse aside County/Seaside land for the cemetery The site, about 81 acres, is located east of al Jim Moore Boulevard and bounded h lats and Parker Flats Cutoff Roads.

Veterans Affairs could not establish a National Cemete the former Fort Ord. However, it could provide gran funds to design and build the cemetery if the California Department of Veterans Affairs designated the site as a state operated and maintained cemetery

In 2006, former State Assembly member John Laird sponsored successful legislation to provide for a state cemetery at the former Fort Ord. The legislation included a proviso that an approximate \$3.5 million endowment for maintenance and operations be set up prior to beginning the construction process. A Citizens Advisory Council (CAC) was formed in June 2007 to obtain necessary agreements to propel the project forward.

The Central Coast State Veterans Cemetery Foundation has raised approximately \$150,000 towards the endowment funding. Assembly member Bill Monning recently introduced pending legislation (AB 1757 allowing full facility design and speeds the process by matching phased construction with phased endowme funding, thereby reducing the amount needed to beg building.
